Statement of Intent:

In order for students to participate in the IB program they must be pursuing the full diploma. If students only want to take one or two IB courses, then AP may be a better option. Earning the IB Diploma requires students to be well-rounded in all core academic areas, as well as active in serving the community. It requires students to develop thinking skills in every core academic area, in addition to foreign language and the arts. Students are responsible to write an authentic 3000 – 4000 word extended essay and complete a course titled “Theory of Knowledge”. Students who successfully complete the IB program and earn the IB Diploma may be eligible for up to 30* university credits. Students who do not earn the full diploma may earn credits for passing scores from HL courses.

We have read the International Baccalaureate (IB) literature and policies and commit our support to participation. We understand that although Weber High has developed a non-exclusionary IB program, with teachers who are committed to excellence, Weber High does not guarantee that a student will earn the diploma or be successful within the program. Students are required to fulfill all IB diploma requirements along with all Utah and Weber School District graduation requirements. We understand that once a student chooses their path within the IB Diploma program, that very few changes are possible. Many courses are a two year commitment so students cannot change classes without jeopardizing their status in the program. We also understand that there is a financial commitment to the IB program and understand that we must pay for both the registration fee and the test fees. This total (as of May 2017) is \$864 dollars per student and is subject to increase. Should we choose to leave the IB Program at any time, any pre-paid test fees will be refunded but registration fees will not be refunded. If a student does not live within Weber High School boundaries they may have to return to his/her zoned school should they choose to exit the IB Diploma Program.
